

# FABRIC PRODUCT CARE

A typical fabric should last 3-6 months before fading begins, depending on how they are used and where they are located. There should be virtually no fading for indoor flags if they are not in direct sunlight. Bringing outdoor flags inside every night can significantly extend their lifespan.

## FABRIC INSTALLATION

Fabric banners are incredibly versatile and can be installed in a variety of ways. Use cords, hanging clips, or bungees to attach the corner grommets to poles, hooks, and flag pole ropes. For indoor use, the fabric is light enough to be hung using rope or a plain pole for a more aesthetically pleasing look. You can also use screws and washers to install your banners to rigid backgrounds such as wood, walls, or concrete. Fabric banners with pole pockets can easily be hung by sliding a pole or a rod through the pole pocket.

## CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric products can be machine washed on cold and on a gentle cycle for up to 3 washes. After washing the fabric, it should be laid flat or hung to dry. Use a hand steamer to get rid of wrinkles or creases. Do NOT bleach, iron, or tumble dry, doing so can result in permanent damage to the fabric.

**WARNING : DO NOT bleach, iron, or tumble dry.**



## STORING FABRIC FLAGS & BANNERS


Your fabric should be stored in a dry location at room temperature and out of direct sunlight. Roll the sign with the print side facing out, if possible, to prevent wrinkling or creasing.

## REMOVING WRINKLES OR CREASES

After shipping or storage, fabric banners can have unsightly wrinkles or creases. To remove the wrinkles from your banner or flag, use a hand steamer and the wrinkles should come right out. If you install or display your fabric banner tightly stretched, the wrinkles and creases will also go away.
